No where in the Old Testament does it say what we're supposed to be doing on the Sabbath other than not working. In Luther's Catechism he mentions that going to church and hearing the Word of God is a good thing to do. And certainly, the Word of God gives us a peace and rest that passes all understanding. Years ago, I remember reading an article in the magazine, Christianity Today, entitled: "Sabbath Breakers!" Surprisingly (or not so surprisingly) it wasn't with the lay folks in the pew in mind. It was written to challenge pastors who refuse to rest and take a day off. I remember a pastor's conference where the speaker asked how many pastors take a day off. Only about half raised their hands. Sinners! This kind of behavior leaves a poor example for the church to do what the Lord has clearly called us all to do: Rest.

Jesus himself separated himself from the work of teaching and healing to spend time alone with the Father. After a very busy day of teaching and ministry Mark records that Jesus got up early while it was still dark, left the house where he was staying so he could pray. Simon went searching for Jesus to tell him that people were looking for him—they needed him. "Get back to work, Jesus". But Jesus needed to rest in the presence of the Father. Other times the gospel writers tell of Jesus separating himself along with the disciples so that they could rest after a period of ministry.

Being a follower of Jesus can mean several things. But one thing it must mean is following Jesus' example. And that includes taking note of the pattern of our Lord who separated himself from work and people so that he could rest. Jesus taught his disciples to do their work out of a place of rest. In fact, our spiritual productivity is dependent on this. Jesus said, "I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing." (John 15:5) We are all called, not to just work, but to bear fruit. And this can only happen when we take our seasons of rest (daily, weekly, monthly, etc.) and learn to abide in Christ who bears kingdom fruit to the measure we are connected to him. If we will not separate time for this kind of rest, it may be that someday we'll discover we wasted time on things of lesser priority. And that would be a waste of time.
